Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. <sup>2</sup> Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. <sup>3</sup> For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God. <sup>4</sup> When Christ, who is your life, appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. <sup>5</sup> Put to death, therefore, whatever belongs to your earthly nature: sexual immorality, impurity, lust, evil desires and greed, which is idolatry. <sup>6</sup> Because of these, the wrath of God is coming. <sup>7</sup> You used to walk in these ways, in the life you once lived. <sup>8</sup> But now you must also rid yourselves of all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander, and filthy language from your lips. <sup>9</sup> Do not lie to each other, since you have taken off your old self with its practices <sup>10</sup> and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator. <sup>11</sup> Here there is no Gentile or Jew, circumcised or uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave or free, but Christ is all, and is in all.

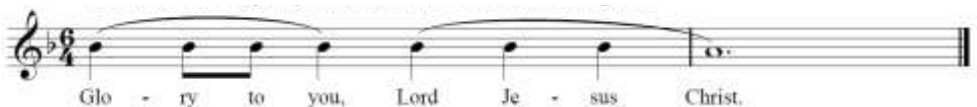

### VOTE FOR BETTER ACCESS TO ST PETER'S

St Peter's has lodged an application for a community project grant with the State Government to fund the installation of an access ramp to aid accessibility to the church and its buildings. **The My Community Grant project commenced 15 July** and if you are a member of the local **Willoughby** state electorate you are eligible to participate. The project involves installing two ramps to improve access to the Church, the Memorial Hall, the landing of the Lower Hall (where various community groups meet) and to Neutral Bay Kindergarten. Our concern is that access to these spaces could be improved for prams, wheelchairs and those with less mobility. ## **WEBSITE UPDATE**
