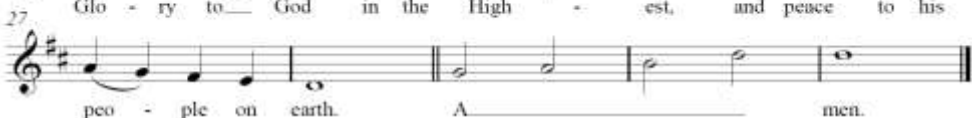

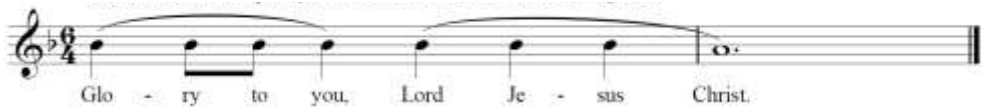

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. ² (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) ³ And everyone went to their own town to register. ⁴ So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. ⁵ He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. ⁶ While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, ⁷ and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

SACRED SULLIVAN - GLENN AMER & MELVYN MORROW

On Sunday 15 September at 2.30pm, St Peter's will host a concert by Glenn Amer and Melvyn Morrow as they celebrate the rich heritage of Arthur Sullivan's inspirational church music.

There's a lot more to Sir Arthur Sullivan than W.S Gilbert – in fact, a heaven of a lot more. In the second half of the 19th century, Sullivan was a prolific composer of popular hymns such as *Lead Kindly Light*, *It Came Upon the Midnight Clear*, *Alleluia Alleluia*, *Hearts to Heaven* and *Voices Raise, Angel Voices Ever Singing* and, of course, *Onward Christian Soldiers*. But there are so many other musical treasures to be enjoyed: compositions which, in their day, caused normally staid Victorian audiences of thousands to applaud and cheer.
