SECOND READING

A reading from Paul's letter to the Colossians 1:1-14

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Timothy our brother,
²To God's holy people in Colossae, the faithful brothers and sisters in Christ:
 Grace and peace to you from God our Father.³We always thank God, the
 Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you, ⁴because we have
 heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love you have for all God's
 people – ⁵the faith and love that spring from the hope stored up for you in
 heaven and about which you have already heard in the true message of the
 gospel ⁶that has come to you. In the same way, the gospel is bearing fruit
 and growing throughout the whole world – just as it has been doing among
 you since the day you heard it and truly understood God's grace. ⁷You
 learned it from Epaphras, our dear fellow servant, who is a faithful minister of
 Christ on our behalf, ⁸and who also told us of your love in the Spirit.

⁹ For this reason, since the day we heard about you, we have not stopped praying for you. We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives, ¹⁰ so that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God, ¹¹ being strengthened with all power according to his glorious might so that you may have great endurance and patience, ¹² and giving joyful thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of his holy people in the kingdom of light. ¹³ For he has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loves, ¹⁴ in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

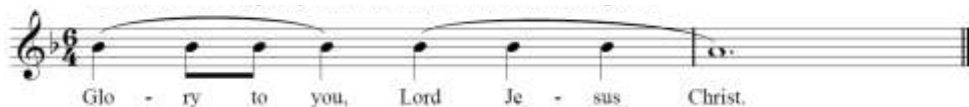

²⁵ On one occasion an expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. ‘Teacher,’ he asked, ‘what must I do to inherit eternal life?’ ²⁶ ‘What is written in the Law?’ he replied. ‘How do you read it?’ ²⁷ He answered, “‘Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind’; and, ‘Love your neighbour as yourself.’” ²⁸ ‘You have

answered correctly,' Jesus replied. 'Do this and you will live.' ²⁹ But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, 'And who is my neighbour?' ³⁰ In reply Jesus said: 'A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he was attacked by robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half-dead. ³¹ A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. ³² So too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. ³³ But a Samaritan, as he travelled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him. ³⁴ He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, brought him to an inn and took care of him. ³⁵ The next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper. "Look after him," he said, "and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have." ³⁶ 'Which of these three do you think was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?' ³⁷ The expert in the law replied, 'The one who had mercy on him.' Jesus told him, 'Go and do likewise.'

This is the gospel of the Lord. *Sung* **Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.**

VOTE FOR BETTER ACCESS TO ST PETER'S

St Peter's has lodged an application for a community project grant with the State Government to fund the installation of an access ramp to aid accessibility to the church and its buildings. **The My Community Grant project commences 15 July** and if you are a member of the local electorate (Willoughby) you are eligible to participate. We expect there to be a difficult choice to make between the various grant applications and every vote will help.

The project involves installing two ramps to improve access to the Church, the Memorial Hall, the Lower Hall (where various community groups meet) and to Neutral Bay Kindergarten. Our concern is that access to these spaces could be improved for prams, wheelchairs and those with lesser mobility.
