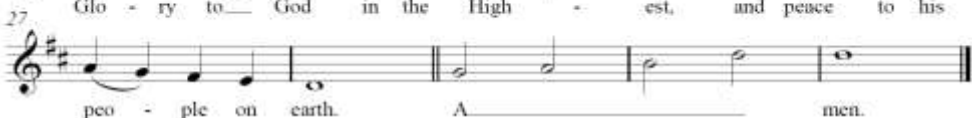

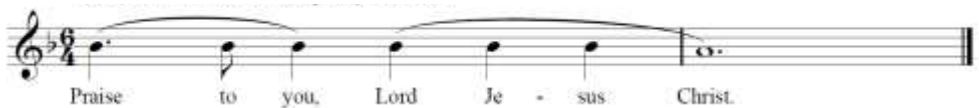

MINI CAKE AND PRODUCE STALL TODAY



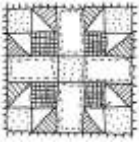
There will be a mini cake and produce stall in the DA Room between services today to raise funds for Kingsdene Special School and Residential services, an initiative of Anglicare.
